1. Minutes approval

- Minutes of the 23 January meeting were approved with minor changes.

2. Matters arising from the Minutes, not otherwise on the agenda

- The need for more staff working with events will be discussed alongside with the 'Target Sweden' memo that Stephanie is developing.
- ICAN has indicated that they are happy to collaborate on the development of research ideas but that they cannot commission research themselves.
- It was reminded that the internal deadline for research proposals to DoS's for the Wallenberg foundations is 23 February.

3. Report back

- Dan reported on how he had presented SIPRI data through advanced visualisation on big screen at Davos, courtesy Carnegie Mellon University.
- A draft MoU and project proposal for joint work with the WFP on food security and peace building will be signed during Executive Director David Beasley's visit to Stockholm on 2 February.
- Jakob had been in talks with the Riksdag about joint events and briefings during 2018.
- Preparations for the June conference on the Baltic Sea region on broad security are proceeding. A formal concept note has been submitted.
- The SIPRI statutes will be amended shortly, in line with SIPRI proposals.
- A revised proposal for a strategic programme of work for 2018 and 2019 has been submitted to the MFA.
- Gary reported on feedback from the Peace & Development Cluster. SMT particularly agreed that the work to increase diversity among SIPRI staff
