Environment of Peace 2022

2022 is the 50th anniversary of the Stockholm Conference – the UN Conference on the Human Environment, the first major inter-governmental meeting to bring the natural environment centre stage. By 2022 it will be seven years since A New Climate for Peace, a report on climate change and insecurity for the G7, the last major international report on the issue. Since 2015, much has unfolded in climate change and knowledge about it. The Environment of Peace 2022 (EP2022) project will take a broader view on the environment than previous reports that have addressed the peace and security dimensions of the unfolding crisis. It will look at both the negative impact of environmental change on security and the positive relationship between building sustainable peace and climate action for resilience. The purpose of the EP2022 project is to focus international attention on practical steps to address the negative impact of today's environmental crises on tomorrow's prospects for peace and security.
