>>> Monitoring and seeking to influence the development and implementation of key export control instruments (EUCP, ATT, DU Regulation, WA, MTCR, AG, NSG etc.)

>>> Work on SDG16.4 measurement in LAC. Using the data in the ATT assistance mapping database to do regional analyses of capacities and needs in LAC, SSA, and Asia.

- Strengthening SALW controls through development assistance w/ Marina
- Mapping and promoting good practices in end-use controls w/ AMEX
- The first six years – stock-taking of the ATT w/ AMEX
- Erosion of IHL constraints and arms transfers to conflicts w/ AMEX

- Missile technology control between non-proliferation and arms control w/ Tytti and Pieter
- Arms exports and the African Peace Facility (APF) w/ Timo
