HR:

##### *Employee Survey & Work Environment Training*

- This year, we will not conduct a new employee survey with Zondera. Instead, we will continue to work with the results from the last survey and give our new Director the chance to familiarize himself with the organization.

One important issue raised in the survey was harassment. We want to stress that if you experience or witness harassment, please report it to your line manager, HR, or another manager. Support will be provided – but if incidents are not reported, we cannot take action.

- All managers will also participate in a two-day training on work environment on 14 and 21 October. The training will cover legal requirements and provide space for discussion and questions. We are currently working with the external provider to finalize the programme.

- One of the agenda points for the retreat is for the SMT to develop – with guidance from Jair – a **“Scenario-building for the future of SIPRI”**. During the Home Day on September 11<sup>th</sup> we will then all engage in a scenario exercise on how to best prepare for SIPRI’s journey in the coming 5 years. The idea is to have an engaging exercise with everyone, to try to foresee and prepare, to increase organizational flexibility and stimulate dialogue. To validate and to get some “inside-outside” perspectives, this exercise will then be followed by a workshop with the Governing Board in the morning of October 8<sup>th</sup>

- Invitations have been sent out to **two RSC meetings** (18 and 25 September) – the plan for the first of these meetings is to discuss the agenda for the Governing Board, give a financial update and for the RSC working group to present the outcome of their work. The second meeting is planned to be held in a workshop format to discuss the ideas on how to activate RSC. We are still looking for volunteers to take the minutes. Please let Priscila know if you would like to be the minute-taker.
- We realize that you are all very busy and that it might be challenging to engage in all these events – the home day, RSCx2, and workshop with the Board – but we hope that as many as possible can take part in all or most of these activities, as they are a good chance for us all to collectively engage as we enter a next phase for SIPRI, under its new Director.
