Operations

GAD:

- Congratulations to the Weapons of Mass Destruction team for securing a new project titled 'Dialogue on Multi-Domain Escalation Risks', funded by the Swedish-based Global Challenges Foundation, for around EUR 74 000.
- Congratulations to the Climate Change and Risk team for securing a 2-year project with the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs, in collaboration with the Norwegian Institute of International Affairs, to support research on Climate, Peace, and Security for the Danish government during their UN Security Council seat from 2024 to 2026. Total funding is 5M DKK and half of it will go to SIPRI.

Armament and Disarmament

- Last Friday the A&D cluster held a very insightful and at times mindboggling workshop on arms control implications of quantum technologies, jointly with Quantum Delta in The Hague. Thanks to Alex and Vivianne who organised and to Kolja, Vitaly and Bob Kelley who participated. This was back to back with a larger event organised by Quantum Delta with the UN International Computing Centre (UNICC) to prepare the international year of Quantum, at which Alex and Sibylle co-chaired the peace and security breakout session.
- On Monday and Tuesday Kolja and Lauriane are attending the Chaudfontaine Group meeting in Liege, an annual meeting of officials, academics and researchers working on dual-use export controls.
- Nan and Lorenzo are in Brussels Monday to Wednesday for various meetings with the Directorate-General for Defence Industry and Space on work relating to EU defense industry.
- Diego has a meeting with the Colombian Ambassador on Monday to discuss possibilities to continue collaborations with them following the end of the project with the Colombian Ministry of Defence.
- On Wednesday, Diego will be a speaker on a webinar hosted by the Inter-Parliamentary Union, titled 'How Can Parliaments Secure a Peace Dividend? Allocating for peace'.
- The AT team wants to highlight that the team continues to receive many enquiries about Israeli arms imports/exports. These saw quite a spike after the backgrounder before the anniversary.
