Armament and Disarmament

Last week:

- Jules is back from a workshop he attended last week on "Towards A Quantitative Treatment of Emerging Technologies, Risk, and Governance." The event was organized by Berkeley Risk and Security Lab with funding from the UK FCDO. Jules presented on how AI may drive strategic instability.
- Laura, Alex and Netta are back from the meeting of the Group of Governmental Experts on autonomous weapons. The key takeaway was that the discussions were surprisingly constructive given the current context.
