#### **Operations**

HR:

- Upcoming arrivals:
  - Joshua Wilks will start remotely from 22 September as Research Assistant for four months with the Food Peace and Security, Sahel Resilience Partnership and the new research collaboration with International Organization for Migration in South Sudan.
- A new email address – [workenvironment@sipri.org](mailto:workenvironment@sipri.org) – has been created as an additional way to report work environment issues.  
Through this address, employees can report:
  - Risk observations – potential hazards before anything has happened.
  - Incidents – when something happened that could have caused harm but did not.
  - Accidents – when an event has led to injury, illness, or damage.
- Reports can also be made directly to HR, to your line manager, to a safety representative, or to facilities – or simply to any responsible colleague who can help solve the problem immediately. The important thing is that issues are acted upon quickly. If something can be resolved on the spot, that is encouraged. HR must, however, always be informed so that the matter can be documented and included in our work environment follow-up.  
Urgent matters are dealt with straight away, other reports are followed up in the Work Environment Group, and once a year the Safety Committee reviews all cases to see if there are patterns that need further action.

GAD:

- Congratulations to Vitaly (WMD Programme)! GAD has countersigned a contract for a project with the Pacific Northwest National Laboratory (PNNL) for the production of three case studies on Nuclear Forensics in 2026 and 2027.  
Budget: USD 84,231 (798,845 SEK)
- Congratulations to Tytti (WMD Programme)! GAD countersigned a contract for a project titled 'RRBS – Exploring possibilities for risk reduction in the Baltic Sea region'. The main deliverables are an in-person roundtable meetings to be held in Stockholm in November or December 2025 - and the bigger project application that this seed funding project will also produce by March 2026. The donor is Svenska institutet (SI). The project started on 15 September and will run until 31 May 2026. Budget: SEK 475,495
- Congratulations to Virginie and Marie (Sahel and West Africa Programme)! GAD has countersigned a contract for a project titled 'Bridging research and humanitarian response for an evidence-based approach to displacement in the Chad–Sudan borderlands'.
- The donor is the International Initiative for Impact Evaluation (3ie), funded through the UK's FCDO Research Connection programme. The project starts on 1 October 2025 and runs until 31

December 2026.

Budget: GBP 29,449 (377,566 SEK)

- As part of Strategic Grant deliverables, SIPRI will host a roundtable on Thursday morning entitled 'Finding Common Ground: Development Cooperation in Fragile and Conflict-affected Settings' with Swedish and European policy makers. Luc will moderate the discussion and Jingdong, Barbara MT and Johan Schaar will present alternative regional models of cooperation. Caroline and Florian will also take part and Charlotta will provide welcome remarks. There will be a follow up workshop in November which will be a broader set of civil society actors.
